- management of information security (e.g. ISO/IEC 27000 family of ISMS standards), and related service and technology management supporting standards (e.g. TTP services, IT network security, intrusion detection, information security incident management),
- mechanisms and techniques for security (e.g. encryption and digital signature mechanisms, and authentication techniques),
- security evaluation and assurance criteria for products and systems,
- and more recently they have embarked on new work in the areas of cyber-security, web applications security, ICT preparedness for business continuity, ID management, and privacy technologies.
